

Community Revitalization Partnership Investment Opportunities

We are committed to providing a positive experience for everyone involved in our rebuilding projects. Community Revitalization Partners that choose to “adopt” a house/community space as a rebuilding project will serve as the volunteer team to provide the repairs.

The team will select a crew leader to recruit and manage volunteers, regularly attend meetings, and procure project materials. In return, we will identify an appropriate rebuilding project based on the volunteer team’s skill level, train and support the crew leader, as well as provide construction resources and skilled labor as needed. While it is common for our partners to provide a volunteer team to participate in the rebuilding project it is not mandatory— we can layer your funding with other partner support to ensure that the highest level of impact is provided.

National Rebuilding Day: Saturday, April 25, 2020

**Geographic Area: Southside Richmond: Oakgrove/
Bellemeade neighborhood**

National Rebuilding Day (NRD) is held the last Saturday in April. More than 1,000 volunteers throughout the Greater Richmond region provide an array of repairs to homes and community spaces in a particular neighborhood. Each project site comes with its own unique history and work scope. Once deployed, volunteers will participate in various activities—from yard cleanup and painting to skilled repairs and home safety modifications.

Fall Fix-Up Day: October 2020

**Geographic Area: Tri-Cities
(Petersburg, Hopewell, Chesterfield)**

Fall Fix-Up Day is our annual, one-day “blitz-build,” that takes place in the Tri-Cities area of Virginia. Volunteers, skilled and unskilled, come together to repair the homes of homeowners in need.

Partner Builds: Year-Round

**Geographic Area: Richmond, Petersburg, Hopewell,
Chesterfield, and Henrico**

In an effort to provide home repair services year-round, we give community revitalization partners (sponsors) the opportunity to participate in our Partner Build Program. These projects occur throughout the year and are often of limited scope, making them ideal for smaller volunteer teams and those who are not available for National Rebuilding Day or Fall Fix-Up Day.
